Pentecost Sunday

Year A

30th/31st May, 2020

Peace be with you all

As we come to the end of the Easter Season we are looking forward to celebrating the Feast of Pentecost. The word 'Pentecost' in fact means fifty, so we celebrate this feast 50 days after the Easter. I think it is very interesting to know what had happen on the first Pentecost.

You can get the clear picture of it in the Acts of the Apostles Chapter 2:1-11 and in the Gospel of John 20:19-23.

For the past two and half months we have been in lockdown due to the Corona pandemic. We were fearful, worried, we lost the freedom to move around and there were lots of restrictions on our lives. Yes, it was something similar in the case of the apostles in Jerusalem. Once Jesus has been resurrected the apostles were not able to see him physically, they thought they had lost everything. So they were afraid of the Jews, they were shameful of preaching about Jesus. They could not do anything but to lock themselves in the upper room. How terrible would these conditions have been for the apostles? However, they were still praying together.

As they were praying together Jesus came down among them and said "peace be with you". When you are fearful your mum or dad, or spouse or partner or friend says to you 'don't worry my friend I am here'. It gives us much comfort. Their presence makes a big difference in our lives. It was exactly what happened in the lives of the apostles. When we are worried, or fearful we have to ask for the help of God who can fill us with his loving presence and peace. So the first gift of Pentecost is the peace of Christ.

The second gift is the gift of an advocate, the Holy Spirit, who guides us. Have you seen the Holy Spirit? Yes the Holy Spirit is with us and within us. We have received the Holy Spirit at the time of our Baptism and strengthened through the Sacrament of Confirmation and nourished through the Eucharist. The life in us is the best example of Holy Spirit.

The final gift of the Pentecost is an appointment or mission, the mission which we received through our Christian life. This mission is carried throughout our lives; in another sense we have to be an apostle for Jesus in this world, or by giving witness to Christ through our beautiful life. This life is continued in our church.

The season of Easter comes to an end through this feast. Now we move on to Ordinary Time. The colour of the vestments changes, the Easter candle is replaced to the baptistery, the drapes in the church changes and we try to live the mission of Jesus in our lives. And it is the power of the Holy Spirit that gives us the strength and courage to live our lives.

Slowly we are coming out from the lockdown; soon we will be coming together to proclaim the joy of Easter in our churches and communities. Let join together in the prayer of the church "Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your spirit and they shall be created and you will renew the face of the earth".

So I wish you all of the blessings of the Pentecost. May God bless you all.

READINGS THE FEAST OF PENTECOST

First Reading *Apostles 2:1-11*

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Responsorial Psalm

Lord, send out your Spirit and renew the face of the earth.

Second Reading *Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13*

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia!

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.

The Eucharist joins heaven and earth; it embraces and penetrates all creation. The world which came from God's hands returns to him in blessed and undivided adoration: in the bread of the Eucharist, "creation is projected towards divinisation, towards the holy wedding feast, towards unification with the Creator himself". Thus, the Eucharist is also a source of light and motivation for our concerns for the environment, directing us to be stewards of all creation.

Gospel *John 20:19-23*

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you.'

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

After saying this he breathed on them and said:

'Receive the Holy Spirit.

For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven;

for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'
